GENERAL PROCEDURE FOR LATIN HONORS PLANNING

This process is designed to guide you in creating a plan for your Latin honors work, which is completed over the last 60 credits of your undergraduate career. Since Latin honors is associated with your degree, the planning process involves you, your major department, and the University Honors Program.

STEP 1: At the end of your sophomore year, make a Latin honors planning appointment with your honors advisor. At this meeting:

- You and your advisor will design an individualized path toward graduating with Latin honors.
- Your advisor will sign this form after your discussion and provide the name and contact information of the honors faculty representative in your major. Together you will identify questions or issues to raise with the honors faculty representative
- Your advisor may suggest resources to complement your goals, such as the University's Undergraduate Research website: www.research.umn.edu/undergraduate, and departmental and college websites.

STEP 2: After exploring the resources suggested by your honors advisor, you will:

- Set up a meeting with the honors faculty representative in your major. Bring this form (and a copy of your APAS) with you.
- Be prepared to discuss your plans and goals, including ideas for faculty mentors, courses, or research areas. In particular, ask about Honors opportunities in your major and any thesis-related courses or activities that the department may require.

STEP 3: At your meeting with your honors faculty representative:

- Your honors faculty representative will welcome and introduce you to the scholarly life of the department, giving an overview of opportunities for involvement in research or creative expression.
- If you are not already working with a thesis advisor, the honors faculty representative may suggest names of faculty members who could mentor you throughout the development of your thesis project.
- The honors faculty representative may suggest 5xxx- and 8xxx-level departmental courses or other non-course options that match your goals and would enhance your education.
- The honors faculty representative may review requirements the department may have established for completing an Honors thesis.
- The honors faculty representative will sign and date this form.

STEP 4: After your meeting with the honors faculty representative:

- Make a copy of the Latin Honors Planning form for your records and then return it to the honors office, 390 Northrop.
- Contact the suggested faculty who may be willing to serve as your thesis advisor.
- Follow up on any other recommendations made by the honors faculty representative or your honors advisor.
- Once you have found a thesis advisor and defined a thesis project, fill out an Honors Thesis Proposal form (available at www.honors.umn.edu), which must be signed by the thesis advisor and returned to the honors office.
